

# PHOTOVOICE CONTEST

### What is Photovoice?


Developed in the 1990s by Caroline Wang and Mary Ann Burristo, this method gives individuals or communities the opportunity to document and share their experiences, perspectives and concerns. It is often used in community-based research, social work and participatory action projects to make the voices of marginalised or underrepresented groups heard. In our project, we focused on highlighting issues and challenges in the young people's local communities. This method gave young people the opportunity to raise their voices about their personal challenges or the challenges of their communities and to raise public awareness.

#### Guidelines & Framework

To promote clarity, transparency, and fairness throughout the competition, the consortium has meticulously prepared a comprehensive set of rules and guidelines. These documents helped contestants. They describe admission criteria, ethical considerations. contest rules and gave step-by-step a instructions on how to participate.

The consortium shared them on the project website and encourage any other youth organisations to use them in similar initiatives.

### Implementation of Photo-Voice Contest



To take part, young people between 18 and 30 years old from Poland, Italy, Spain, Greece and Lithuania had to submit the photos that fell into one of the following themes/categories:

- Poverty
- Unemployment
- Education
- Environment (protection and/or degradation of biodiversity)
- Problems in Europe
- Accessibility
- Realities of the different generations
- Introspective images (e.g. self-portraits, LGBTQ+, mental health)


Along with the photo, participants sent a 3D file (.stl), author's short biography and a brief description. **38 photos** were submitted in the competition.





All entries underwent an initial screening to ensure that they fulfil the basic entry and submission criteria. Then, international jury of seven professionals evaluated all photos and selected 5 finalists from each participating country, resulting in a total of 25 finalist photos.

25 finalists' photos were presented in the online exhibition. Anyone with access to the contest platform could cast one vote for their favorite one from each participating country. The 5 winners were determined based on the highest number of votes received. The winning photo from each country will be soon turned into a 3D-printed lithophane and exhibited at national events.
